In contrast to Europe, Japan and North America, popular awareness of the value of conservation of the historical built environment is a recent phenomenon in Hong Kong. Although there is now a widespread public appreciation of our surviving architectural heritage, legislation and planning policy do little to enable effective conservation. There are few incentives that encourage the retention and sensitive exploitation of heritage buildings.

This conference aims to initiate discussions over the building, social and economical aspects of conservation of our built environment and its implication on the building profession. We believe through sharing the solid experiences and views among the renowned international speakers, key government officials, industry practitioners and academia, the importance of heritage conservation can be further addressed.
